

What is a double degree in International Social Work?

VIVES University of Applied Sciences in Kortrijk, Belgium and the Protestant University of Applied Sciences in Ludwigsburg, Germany jointly offer a seven-semester bachelor's degree in International Social Work. This means:

- · For VIVES-students: 5 semesters in VIVES Belgium, two semesters in EH Germany.
- · For EH-students: 5 semesters in EH Germany, two semesters in VIVES Belgium.

At the end of the study program, students from Belgium and Germany are awarded a dual recognition of their academic qualification by both universities.

A double degree in International Social Work will prepare students in a broad range of knowledge and competence that equip them to deal with the demands of a globalized world where social problems seem intractable and insurmountable.
